		Network Development
		Theme 1: Cost of living theme using the systemic solutions to poverty puzzle diagram:
		The following puzzle pieces were recommended as focus: Affordable Housing, Access to Health Care, Affordable Childcare,
		Public Transit, End Stigma and Discrimination, Income Security (Basic Income Guarantee and Cost of Living)
		 Other puzzle pieces can be addressed as well if there are enough people interested and willing to do the work
		Where community groups already exist and the work is already being done, the task group may fold but NPRN will stay
		connected
		Each puzzle piece will use the cost of living lens to:
		Inventory existing poverty-related data and /or determine how to access data;
		Review data gaps and bring to NPRN for input
		Identify people and groups connected to puzzle pieces already. Confirm they are using evidence. Determine who is
		missing
		Determine strategies and solutions for what we want to accomplish and how it connects with cost of living
