In Niagara, poverty costs us all 1.38 billion dollars annually. There are 55,644 people in Niagara who live below the Low Income Measure. They are our friends, family, neighbours and members of our community. When you give this holiday, and throughout the year, we want to ensure your heartfelt generosity creates the impact you want to see.

So how do we give with dignity and with social justice in mind?

Here are ten easy ways you can make your gift giving even more impactful:

1. Be Kind: Myth bust, call out discrimination when you hear it or see it, be an ally.
2. Learn About Your Community: What is happening to move things forward in your community?
3. Make Informed Decisions: Do your research. Support ethical, inclusive organizations & products.
4. Get Involved: Share your gifts and talents. Meet your neighbours. Find your way to be engaged!
5. Listen: Share space by actively listening to someone's story. Storytelling is powerful.
6. Be Inquisitive: Ask important questions, but don't be invasive.
7. Watch Your Language: The experience of poverty is harmful - don't perpetuate discrimination.
8. Take Action: Advocate for change, in a respectful manner, to undo harmful social systems.
9. Value Experience: Volunteer, support a charity event, organize a neighbourhood block party.
10. Buy Local: Support local vendors, farmers, artisans and neighbours who make Niagara unique!

The NPRN encourages people this holiday, and throughout the year, to give and live with social justice in mind. Start to have the conversations we need to have: let's talk about supporting policies and programs that increase opportunities such as adequate access to aid, affordable housing and child care, a living wage and other initiatives that improve the quality of life for all people in Niagara.
